 The President of SIFRE, Revd Cliff Reed welcomed all who were present and handed the meeting over to the Chairman, Martin Spettigue.

- 13. Minutes of the Eighteenth AGM held on 4th September 2012
 These were accepted as a true record of the meeting. Proposed by Cliff Reed, seconded by Jan Lelijveld and accepted nem con.
- 14. Matters arising
 There were no matters arising.
- 15. The Report of the Board of Trustees

The Chairman briefly went through the written Directors' and the Inter-Faith Consultant's Report. There were no questions and Bhupindar Sually proposed and Anita Beresford-Webb seconded that the report should be accepted.

16. The Treasurer presented the Annual Accounts for the year 2012-2013. He reported that apart from our loss of significant external funding which had been used to pay our salaried staff, this year's accounts very much mirror previous years'. In terms of income and expenditure there is nothing which he needed to bring to the Members' attention. He said that he was optimistic that the Unrestricted Fund would be sustainable in future years. In this year, the non salaried income exceeded non salaried expenditure by just over £2000. The Board agreed to transfer £25,000 from our reserves of £30,000 to our Salaries fund, and so we finished the year with £13.5K in this fund and we carry a reserve of £5K.

He reminded the meeting that some of our funds are held as stock (recorded at its wholesale price). The wholesale price of our stock was £11.235 and the retail value was £46.5K. These figures include the cost of the Faith Cards which we bought at £1 a pack and occasionally sell at £5.95 a pack. More often than not though we give these away as advertising freebies.

He directed the attention of the Members to the 'simplified SOFA' which was included at the back of the Annual Report. Columns 1, 2 and 3 trace the fortunes of SIFRE for 2010-2011, 2011-2012, and 2012-2013. Column 4 gives the budget for 2012-2013 which was prepared much earlier in the year. Column 5 is a Budget for 2013-2014 which assumes that our Admin Assistant remains in her post till March 2014. The Board however has, since the end of the financial year 2012-2013, taken the view that it ought to preserve its contingency reserve at above the £5K it agreed in the previous year. Consequently and after considerable discussion, it voted to terminate the employment of our Admin Assistant. We have subsequently commenced redundancy procedures and our Assistant's post will terminate on 30th September 2013.

Columns 6 and 7 give budgets for 2014-2015 and in 2015-2016; these indicate that our unrestricted fund trading profit could amount to about £6K.

Barbara Mayhew proposed and David Sharp seconded the acceptance of the accounts.

17. Appointment of Examiner of Accounts for 2013-2014

The treasurer expressed his gratitude to Clive Mees for acting as external examiner of the Accounts and recommended the he be reappointed External Examiner for the coming year. This was proposed by the Treasurer accepted by all.

18. Election of Board Members

Our Memorandum and Articles require one third of the Board (3 Members) to stand down at each AGM and seek re-election. Denis Johnston was co-opted on 11/6/2013 and was willing to stand for election. Rose Norgate was standing down and did not wish to stand for re-election; Martin Spettigue offered to stand down and seek re-election. There were no other candidates. Bhupindar Sually proposed and Barbara Mayhew seconded the appointment of these candidates and the Members agreed nem con.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEE DIRECTORS FOR 2013 – 2014.

The Board of Suffolk Inter-Faith Resource (SIFRE) is pleased to present its Report and Financial Statement for the year ending 31st March 2014.

Reference and Administrative Details of the Charity, its Trustees and Advisers.

The Charity is an Incorporated Private Limited Company (Company No 2992865) registered on 22 November 1994 and registered as a charity on 6 December 1994. The registered address of the Company is The Inter-Faith centre, The West Building, University Campus Suffolk, Waterfront Building, Neptune Quay, Ipswich. IP4 1QJ.

The Charity has accommodation which is provided by University Campus Suffolk. This accommodation houses a library / seminar room and resource centre, an office, and a store room. It is furnished with fittings previously provided by the Suffolk New College and by University Campus Suffolk and / or donated by other supportive groups.

Structure, Governance and Management.

The charitable company is constituted as a limited company and is governed by its memorandum and articles of association.

Membership of SIFRE.

SIFRE recognises three categories of membership. These are:

MEMBERS OF THE COMPANY: are those individuals who have registered their membership with the Company and have paid their annual subscription fee.

- They are eligible to attend and vote at General Meetings,
- They can stand for election to the Board,
- They receive all SIFRE's mailings,
- They can attend meetings of the Forum of Faiths,
- They pay an annual subscription of £15.

ASSOCIATES: are individuals who support and engage in the activities of SIFRE but do not wish to be involved in the running of the Company.

- They will receive all SIFRE mailings except Company Members' mailings,
- They can attend but not vote at General Meetings,
- They can attend meetings of the Forum of Faiths,
- They will pay an annual subscription of £10.

AFFILIATE GROUPS: are established faith groups and other organisations who wish to be involved in Inter-Faith activity.

- They will receive all SIFRE mailings except Company Members' mailings,
- They will be invited to appoint two of their number to serve on the Forum of Faiths,
- They will pay an annual subscription of £25,
- Their representatives can attend but not vote at General Meetings.

All categories of membership showed little change this year. A list of Members, Associate and Affiliate bodies is appended to this report.

The Board of SIFRE.

The Board of the Suffolk Inter-Faith Resource comprises up to 9 members who are elected by the Company Members at the Annual General Meeting. Board members normally serve for a period of 3 years, one third of the Board standing down each year. Those who stand down may seek reelection to the Board at the AGM. The Officers of the Board are appointed at the first Board Meeting following the AGM. The Board met four times in 2013 – 2014.

All the meetings were quorate.

SIFRE Staff.

In 2013-2014 SIFRE employed one member of staff who acted as an admin assistant and resources officer up until September 30^{th} 2013.

The volunteer team of 4 Faiths Officers together with various other volunteers have assisted in the delivery of SIFRE's programme.

SIFRE continued to be housed in a suite of three rooms in the West Building of UCS. These provided a library / seminar room, an office and a store room. The accommodation, designated 'The Inter-Faith Centre' is used for some of SIFRE's activities and some conducted jointly with the East of England Faiths Agency. SIFRE members are often employed by EEFA for the delivery of commissioned events.

Until the cessation of her employment, the Resources Officer (Anna-Marie) represented SIFRE on a number of committees as well as being the presence in the Inter-Faith Centre. Anna-Marie was the telephone voice of SIFRE and "keeper" of the Centre. Apart from acting as receptionist and assisting other members, she was responsible for checking books in and out of the library, recording the borrowing of resources and generally keeping things ship-shape.

Rose Norgate has continued as Faith Officer in Waveney and Barbara Mayhew has been representing SIFRE in a variety of countywide networks. David Capey remained the voluntary Executive Officer.

SIFRE's staff continued to be involved in statutory committees and it values the networking and awareness raising potential of this involvement. In particular, SIFRE representatives serve on various committees on diversity and equality.

SIFRE receives no core funding income from other bodies. Its only income comes from membership fees and donations, from the sale of its Handbook and the Diversity Game, and from tutors working for EEFA who choose to donate their earnings to SIFRE.

Inter-Faith Week activities and the 2014 Holocaust Memorial event were arranged by EEFA (commissioned by SCC) with significant input from Christy Hendry, an intern / project student provided by the Events Management Department of University Campus Suffolk.

The day to day work of SIFRE continued to be conducted by two full time voluntary staff who work from home, and until October 2013, one part time salaried staff who work from the SIFRE Centre. The following staff have been associated with SIFRE in the last year.

The Board would like to express its gratitude to all staff and volunteers for the work they have done for SIFRE in this last year. In particular it wishes to name Liz Bennett who has been involved with the 'Open the Box' project.

Board Responsibilities in Respect of the Financial Statements.

Company law requires the Board Members of SIFRE to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company at the year-end and of the net incoming/outgoing resources of the charitable company for the year then ending. In preparing these financial statements, the Board Members are required to.

- □ Select suitable accounting policies.
- □ Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.
- □ State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.
- □ Prepare financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the company will continue on that basis.

The Board Members are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable it to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

External Examiner.

In accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 1985 a resolution proposing that Clive Mees be reappointed as external examiner of the Company will be put to the Annual General Meeting.

Objectives, Activities and Achievements.

The purpose of the charity is to advance public knowledge and understanding of the teachings, beliefs, traditions and practices of the different religions and philosophies (including their distinctive features and common ground) of communities in Britain and in particular in Suffolk and East Anglia.

In Lowestoft and the Waveney District, our SIFRE Circle has continued under Rose Norgate's leadership. The SIFRE Circle has been meeting regularly and they were involved in Inter-Faith Week activities, the Christmas Tree project in Beccles and in Holocaust Memorial Day in Lowestoft.

In Bury St Edmunds, the reading group and a study group continue to meet.

In Bealings, Jan Lelijveld leads a Circle which meets on a regular basis to discuss a variety of topics.

Our ongoing work with the hospitals and our support for their developing multi-faith Chaplaincies is particularly important.

SIFRE staff have continued to serve on numerous statutory and voluntary sector committees including the Suffolk Joint Diversity Working Group; the Mayor of Ipswich's Civic Celebration of Community; Ipswich Hospital's Respecting Diversity User Group; the Forum of New and Emerging Communities; the Hate Crime Steering Group; the Traveller Support Group; the Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education; the University Campus Suffolk Equality and Diversity Committee; and the Police Diversity Board; the and the Safer Communities forums and the Congress Organising Group.

SIFRE hosted a Seniors' Inter-Faith Tea Party on the first Tuesday of each month up until Anna-Marie's departure.

WHAT SIFRE HAS ACHIEVED IN 2013-2014.

- 1 This past year we have continued our efforts to make our premises fit for purpose and we have explored new ways of functioning to meet current needs.
- 2 Reordering the library this task has now been completed through the groundwork cataloguing by Anna-Marie up to October and then with the professional advice and active involvement of Vanda Broughton who has devoted nearly every Friday to the task. Our large collection of books can now be viewed on-line and the plan is to create links to the UCS and Suffolk libraries.
- "Open the Box" project with a grant obtained through SACRE we piloted a scheme through which schools could hire boxes of books and artefacts to support RE. It includes faith boxes for Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Humanism, Islam, Judaism, Paganism and Sikhism. Liz Bennett, the co-ordinator, is continuing to run the project.
- 4 "Facing up to Faith in Suffolk" we have been compiling this on-line book with a view to highlighting basic facts about the faiths of Suffolk, and including more detailed information for those who need it. A wide range of people have also contributed their personal stories and there are other articles for inspiration and reflection. The collection of personal stories will also be printed and be on sale in the Autumn.
- 5 Strengthening our links —we continue to build our connections with the wider community and are trying out different ways of publicising our seminars and other events. We hope to attract the attention of students and staff to our facilities and programme and are pleased that they are becoming more involved with us in the local arrangements for established events like HMD and Inter-Faith Week.
- During the Autumn in response to a request to promote inter-faith activities at Ickworth Church we loaned them a small collection of books and shared various other ideas with them.
- 7 Following up an approach to us made by Muslim Doctors at West Suffolk Hospital we established a monthly dialogue group which met in various places including the Chapel and has potential for delivering informal training by and to hospital staff.
- 8 Our links with various departments of the university are growing including with the Art Department. In particular we were able to assist a Rumanian student who had no money to find accommodation through the sheer kindness of Irma.
- 9 Our link with the St Lioba Convent in Egmond has been strengthened through the sterling efforts of Punna Athwall who has taken on the task of co-arranging the annual May conference.
- 10 We have welcomed Barbara Richardson Todd to our team of Faiths Officers.
- 11 Charlotte Stewart has taken on the nurture of an inter-faith group of artists and others meeting on a monthly basis.

Other Observations.

Our inter-faith handbook remains one of our flag ship products. The new fourth edition, re-titled 'A Handbook of Faiths', produced and published in conjunction with the Festival Shop in Birmingham, continues to sell well. Also, our redesigned game 'Diversity', available in a smart A4 sized box with a folding A3 sized playing mat, has been purchased by all sorts of organisations from all parts of the UK. Sadly, the Festival Shop ceased trading in 2010 and we are now the sole distributors of these products.

Financial Review.

I present the Annual Accounts for the year 2013-2014. Like all other charities, SIFRE now finds it impossible to secure core funding and this year the Trustees very reluctantly concluded the we could not continue to employ our Admin Assistant. Regrettably, Anna-Marie's post was

terminated on 30th September last. As a result of this action, the end of year accounts benefit from the saving of six months' salary less Anna-Marie's redundancy payment. Unused money originally allocated for salaries was split between the unrestricted fund and the contingency reserve which is now set at £10K.

In terms of income and expenditure there is nothing which I need to bring to your attention. Income exceeded expenditure by nearly £1.8K and at the end of the financial year our total of cash in bank and capital assets totalled £21K. This is represented by £10K of cash in the bank and saleable stock costed at its purchase price of £11K. The retail value of this stock is currently £45K. This stock includes our Faith Cards which we often give away as a promotional item so it is unlikely that we will realise all of this sum from disposal of our stock.

I return to our Statement of Financial Activities (S.O.F.A.). I have produced a simplified SOFA which is included at the back of the Annual report. It traces in columns 1, 2 and 3 the fortunes of SIFRE for 2010-2011, 2011-2013, and 2013-2014 Columns 5 and 6 are Speculative Budgets for 2014-2015 and 2015-2016.

I am being less optimistic than I was last year in predicting the number of games and books we might sell and also the income from membership fees. Our membership is again increasing, but not to the extent I had hoped. By moving our telephone contract away from BT and lodging it with our internet service provider who has given us a free calls package, I have been able to reduce the actual cost of the internet/telephone package. Wherever possible we are communicating by phone or email and only resorting to post when there is no alternative. Our expenditure on volunteer expenses has however started to increase. Overall I am predicting that in the next two years, our income will exceed our expenditure by about £2.6K a year.

We have some good events, we offer Suffolk a good service. If we can sell ourselves, we have every possibility of stabilising as self funding organisation.

The Board would like to register its appreciation to University Campus Suffolk for providing accommodation and associated service at no cost to SIFRE.

The Future.

The Board continues to examine proposals as to how it should respond to its reduced income and how it might restructure itself to broaden the responsibilities of running SIFRE. It is intended that responsibilities be subdivided such that activities can be more easily and transparently managed. Its working document therefore allies its activities to those it undertakes with EEFA. The working document is presented on the following ages. These proposals are not yet fully implemented. We are grateful to David Sharp for taking the lead in organising our Seminar programme.

SIFRE survived 2013-2014 with reduced staff but nevertheless managed to present a very acceptable programme of events for all of those interested in inter-faith issues.

SIFRE will continue to nurture its study groups and further develop its Forum of Faiths. It will continue to be a membership organisation. It will encourage the growth of its Faith Officer Team and it will endeavour to continue to have a presence in County, District and other sector committees and panels whenever and wherever input is requested. SIFRE looks to new ways of ensuring the faith communities have a voice.

Over the years, SIFRE's range of activities and involvements has been increasing. Besides running an extensive teaching and training programme, running study groups and organising Forum of Faiths meetings, its staff serve on some numerous interagency committees. They have found it increasingly challenging to attend to all of these commitments. At the present time, all sections of the voluntary sector feel challenged by financial instability. Whilst the Board of SIFRE remains optimistic, it realises that it must look seriously at its activities and involvements and it has started to develop its strategy for what is now looking like an extensive period of economic recession.

The Board wishes to express its gratitude to our landlords at University Campus Suffolk for their willingness to continue to accommodate us and to the staff of University Campus Suffolk who continue to make us so welcome, to the members of UCS Estates team who are always friendly and helpful.

During the year, one of our Board Members, Dr Jen Lelijveld, resigned from the Board for personal reasons. The Board wishes to record its gratitude to Jan for his faithful service over the last 7 years. He was instrumental in setting up our annual spring conference in the Netherlands and has hosted and continues to run the Bealings SIFRE Circle. Thank you so much, Jan.

SIFRE is only as successful as those who work for it, as staff and tutors, make it, and the Board would like to acknowledge the parts played by an incredible number of people over the last year.

FAITH OFFICERS' REPORT

The AGM runs from April – March but our work falls more easily into academic years, so I am giving an overview of our activities and achievements over the last 12 months. By Faiths Officers I am meaning a group of people who are working with me in a voluntary capacity (BM, BRT, RN, PA, EB, VB, R el S and CC and also DJ, DS and MS).

It has taken us three years since we moved into our new premises to get it ship-shape — at least to the public eye! Thanks to the help of Vanda Broughton ex Suffolk College librarian, currently Professor of Library Studies at UCL, we have continued rationalising the collection of books and are in the process of making a link with the Suffolk libraries. We also are planning to make a link with UCS library and to highlight the availability of the books, many of which are relevant to various courses — and in particular the Religious Studies joint modular degree course which is planned to run from Autumn 2015 at West Suffolk College in Bury St. Edmunds. With that in mind, we have set aside duplicate copies of books which we are planning to make available to West Suffolk College.

Alongside the books we now have a collection of faith boxes which we loan to schools containing artefacts, books, posters and information about Buddhists, Christians, Hindus, Humanist, Jews, Muslim, Pagans and Sikhs. In partnership with SACRE we received a grant to develop this service under the name of "Open the Box". The emphasis was on exploration of the contents by the children and we have had glowing reports from the schools who participated in the project. It was overseen by Liz Bennett – who also led an extremely ambitious experience for primary school children during inter-faith week 2013. This was called "Open the Tent".

We have been slowly developing relationships with various departments of the University. This has been testing as they have been rearranging their faculties and redeploying their staff. In particular we now have a good link with the Art Department partly because of the accommodation we were able to arrange for a needy Romanian student whom Irma took in. We gained some insights into the attitude of people to Romanians through this contact and we have also met other Fine Arts students.

This has helped to enhance the Art and Spirituality monthly group which started last September and is led by Charlotte Stewart. It now includes potential attendees from Buddhist, Christian, Hindu, Jewish and Muslim backgrounds and is beginning to attract other artists from the workshops upstairs in the West Building. We also have the possibility of loans of various art exhibitions, including one through our Dutch colleague, Marlies, who published "Sharing Mary". She has now prepared an exhibition of Islamic paintings from a Persian background which portray Biblical figures. We hope to arrange some exhibitions with the Art Department

Early this summer we ran some introductory courses in Arabic, NT Greek and Biblical Hebrew. We are continuing to run these on Friday afternoons and could probably provide a catch-up session if more students would like to join. We are having some very lively discussions on Biblical texts.

We have been working on an <u>on-line</u> reference book "Facing up to Faith in Suffolk", composed of general articles about the faiths of Suffolk, their history and their present, including stories about individual lives and inter-faith articles. Last November we printed out a draft copy and presented it to the Mayor of Ipswich at the Celebration of Community. The stories then took on a life of their own and turned themselves into a book which is now with the printers and will be launched in Inter-faith week.

Bury St Edmunds: .

- "We" are in discussions with West Suffolk Hospital about our ongoing involvement with them in the light of our developing relationship with various Doctors there especially those from a Muslim background who value our support and friendship and vice versa.
- "We" are meeting regularly with representatives of the Anglican Diocese and the Cathedral about the role of the latter in inter-faith work.
- We have good links with the Hospice, Unitarians, Quakers, Hospice and Havebury Housing and also with police and a wide network of organisations in West Suffolk.

May weekend Conference in Egmond at St. Llioba Monastery.

Punna Athwall has been liaising with the people at St. Liobal. He arranged the conference there this year and is exploring a 5 year programme. His report will be on our web-site.

Middle East.

More and more people are being drawn into dialogue, networking and action about the Middle East especially the ongoing Israel/Palestinian conflict. We did start a small focus group on the latter but it is dormant at the moment because it has been overtaken by other related events. Currently we need to highlight the evening of Sorrowful Reflection this Sunday at Christ Church Tacket St at 7.30pm to which all are welcome, and a Middle East Conference on Saturday 31st January at West Suffolk College.

Diversity digitising.

The Diversity game is into a new phase. Recently I was asked to address an international conference in Birmingham about the possibility of producing a digital version of it. As a result of my presentation, Diversity has now gone to Japan, Holland, Norway, Switzerland, France and Germany and USA, and the games department of UCS are exploring its adaptation into a digital form to support GCSE R.S.

Pilgrimage game.

The concept for this game which predated Diversity is now back on the drawing board and is likely to emerge as an exploration of/meditation on the Middle East.

Reporting Centre.

We have been invited to become a reporting Centre for Hate Crime especially faith related incidents and have accepted. This will take effect from the start of the academic year.

Inter-faith Week.

An exhibition from Oman – 'Tolerance, Understanding, Coexistence – Oman's Message of Islam' will be on display at Endeavour House.

Harriet Crabtree, Director of the Interfaith Network UK will give the annual faith lecture.

Community engagement – this is going on all the time through conferences, formal meetings, networking and chance encounters! We need everyone to be active ambassadors for SIFRE!.
